

Our commitment to sustainability

Sustainability is at the heart of the way the Met Office operates. Here we describe just some of the ways we conduct business, and look after the environment, our suppliers, the community and our staff.



Environment

Minimising our environmental impact while meeting our objectives.

Enhancing biodiversity

We manage our sites to enhance biodiversity and have achieved the Wildlife Trusts' Biodiversity Benchmark at our headquarters in Exeter where we have a wildflower meadow, two ponds, a 'bee hotel' and basking rocks for reptiles.

Reduce, reuse, recycle

We have reduced waste through initiatives such as promoting the use of reusable cups.

Our plastics, metal, cardboard, paper and glass are all recycled. Our food waste is processed by anaerobic digestion and our garden waste from the grounds is composted. Our residual waste is sent to an incineration facility where the heat created by incineration is used to generate electricity.

Making best use of our water

Water cooling is the most efficient way to cool our supercomputers and we recapture the water from the cooling process and use it to flush our toilets.

Meeting the standard

Since 2008 we have held ISO14001 certification for our Environmental Management System. This has provided a framework for us to improve our environmental performance across our business.

Marketplace

We work with our stakeholders and suppliers to deliver ethical and sustainable procurement through a variety of channels including:

On average, about 20% of our direct spend per month goes to SMEs and our tenders are structured to encourage SME bids wherever appropriate.
