

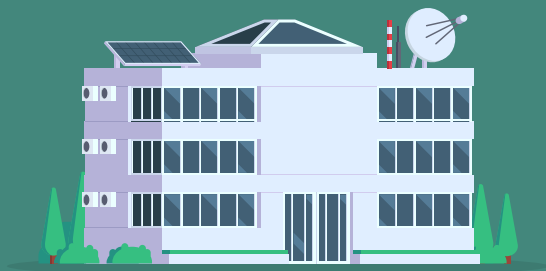


WCSSP in numbers
