Training of Sierra Leone MPs on Utilization of Climate Information

Under the auspices of WISER, ECA conducted training for 50 members of the Parliament of the Republic of Sierra Leone in December 2019. The objective of the training was to strengthen the capacity of the members of parliament in using climate information in the formulation of laws, policies and regulations.

One of the Sierra Leonean MPs that participated in the ToT in Addis Ababa, in collaboration with the Africa Climate Policy Centre, convened and organized the training for the Legislators.

Workshop on climate resilient investment in reconstruction after cyclones Idai and Kenneth

Cyclone Idai and Kenneth hit Mozambique between March and April 2019, killing hundreds of people and leaving over 1.8 million homeless and without basic necessities and infrastructure. Cyclone Idai also caused significant flooding, damage and destruction of homes, resulting in numerous deaths in southern Malawi as well as in eastern Zimbabwe.

The Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) and its partners the Department for International Development (DFID) and the Met Office, convened a workshop in October 2019 for SADC countries to

The two-day training was delivered using a novel design that ensured interactive participation of the members, through Q and As and breakout sessions. Besides providing definitions, sources and users of CIS, members were briefed on developing climate change legislation, budgeting, and monitoring and evaluation.

The MPs in attendance requested that a succinct outcome document tailored to catalyze action in their constituencies be produced. They promised to table a motion in the assembly to adopt the report. As the training took place, the speaker of the assembly, Hon. Abass Bundu, thanked ECA for facilitating the training as he introduced the team to the assembly.

formulate actionable strategies for climate resilient reconstruction of infrastructure in Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe post the devastating tropical Cyclones Idai and Kenneth. The event was informed by the three countries' experiences following the two cyclones.

At the workshop, which was held under the "building back better" approach, the countries shared first hand experiences of the impacts, lessons learnt and effectiveness of responses to the disaster.

A record 140 people who attended the workshop produced recommendations to enhance capacity and resilience in SADC member States.
