



Weather and Climate Science for Service Partnership (WCSSP) Programme

The WCSSP programme is harnessing scientific expertise, to address the impacts of extreme weather and climate change. The programme comprises a network of global partnerships, spanning Brazil, China, India, South Africa and Southeast Asia. It is funded through the UK government's International Science Partnerships Fund (ISPF), with the Met Office serving as a delivery partner.
